Class 53 6 Sticks of rhubarb - All sticks should be uniform in length, they will be judged on depth of colour, uniformity of size (length and thickness). Bunches should be clean and fresh, and bunched with twine at top and bottom. Presentation will also be considered.

Class 53a Strawberries - 10 strawberries presented on a plate, consistency of size, depth of colour and taste will be considered. Presentation will also be considered.

Class 54 6 Scallions - All scallions should be uniform in length and size. Bulb size will be considered. Roots should be trimmed to base of bulbs. Both red and white scallions will be considered. Elastic bands or twine can be used for bunching. Scallions should be cleaned and trimmed. Presentation will also be considered.

Class 55 2 Heads of lettuce - Lettuce heads should be of the same variety and all varieties will be considered. Lettuce should be medium/large but not have developed a 'head'. Lettuce must be fresh. Presentation will also be considered.

Class 56 2 Heads of garden cabbage (same variety) - Summer cabbage of the round or pointed head will be considered. Heads should have a firm but not too big head. Clean outer leaves should be left on. Heads need to be Blemish free and clean. Presentation will be considered.

Class 57 A selection of garden vegetables in a container - 4/5 minimum of different type of vegetables presented in a container.

Class 58 Bunch of mixed herbs - A minimum of 5 varieties bunched together to give a fist sized display. Bound with twine. Colour and variety will be considered, flowers to add to the presentation are permissible.

Class 59 Onions – 3 onions bunches with twine. Greens left on and trimmed to a uniform length,

Cleanly cut, roots should be trimmed. Bound with twine. White and red onions are permissible. Presentation will be considered.

Class 60 Gooseberries – 1 Dish of 10, Consistency of size, depth of colour and presentation will be considered.
